

# SKETCHBOOK ASSIGNMENT

We've done the facial features... we've done facial proportions... Let's see what happens when you put both of them together.

In your sketchbook or on copy paper, draw a face from a magazine or from the internet. Easy enough...

## Rules

- 1 – The picture you draw from can be in black and white or color but it has to be bigger than 3 inches by 3 inches. You will be turning your drawing and the picture you drew from.
- 2 – Please use a regular 2B pencil. This will help you shade things in better.
- 3 – I expect a full range of value so those of you who have a hard time doing value, may I suggest getting a black and white picture? It'll be so much easier for you.
- 4 – The drawing itself must take up the more than  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the paper. Anything smaller and I will not accept it.
- 5 - I expect you to take your time doing this so if it looks like you spent 5 minutes on it... don't turn it in.
- 6 – You can not draw anyone you know so absolutely **NO FAMILY MEMBERS OR FRIENDS**. Trust me on this. This is your first experience drawing faces so don't pick someone you know very well because if it doesn't turn out to look like them, you are going to get upset. I also suggest not choosing someone you are enamored with such as a singer or celebrity. It's easier to draw someone you don't know.
- 7 – It is in your best interest not to trace or grid this picture. Even if it is just a little bit, I will give you a zero. I know how you draw – I've been watching you for an entire semester. I know what every single person in the room is capable of so don't try it.
